Dear Roosevelt Community,

This fall, the Colorado Springs School District 11 Board of Education is putting an initiative on the ballot seeking voter approval of a mill levy override to increase funding for our schools. We are sharing this letter to address common questions about what this might mean for your family and your community.

What is included in the 2017 mill levy proposal for my school?

The mill levy proposal includes the following investments for YOUR school:

- Approximately \$950,000 in new funds every year (about \$1,500 per student)
- \$600,000 for four new portable buildings
- \$196,000 for building safety, air conditioning, electrical, water and gas upgrades

The mill levy proposal includes these annual investments that will benefit ALL District 11 schools:

- **Great Teachers** – A \$15.25 million per year investment to attract and retain great teachers and to reduce classroom sizes.
- **Classroom Technology** – A \$1.32 million per year investment to ensure students have the tools to prepare them for the 21st Century workplace.
- **School Safety** – A \$4.87 million per year investment in enhancing school safety, providing more school counselors, mental health professionals and resource officers.
- **School Maintenance** – A \$17.55 million per year investment to provide critical repairs to dated buildings, stay current on maintenance, and responsibly modernize aging classrooms.

What are the costs associated with these proposals?

The mill levy proposal, if approved, is expected to cost about \$14 per month or \$168 annually for owners of a District 11 home, valued at \$200,000.
